COVID-19: GUIDELINES FOR VISITORS



As we continue to try to minimise the risk of COVID-19 in our school community, we ask for the support and understanding of our visitors.

Please read our COVID-19 guidelines for visitors to our site.

Nunnery Wood Primary is asking for the support and understanding of our visitors in helping us minimise the risk of COVID-19.

Nunnery Wood Primary continues to take guidance from Public Health England and The Villages' Multi-Academy Trust.

Taking this into account, we are now limiting access to the site to essential visitors only. If you are unsure as to whether your proposed visit is considered essential, please email <u>office@nunnerywoodprimary.worcs.sch.uk</u>

If your visit to Nunnery Wood Primary is an essential one, we would nevertheless ask that you refrain from visiting if:

- you have travelled from or transited through any of the countries or areas that are currently on 'lockdown' in the past 14 days. Countries named on the Quarantine List.
- you have developed a fever (above 37.8C) or a new, continuous cough within the last seven days.
- anyone in your household is required to self-isolate in accordance with Government guidelines.

Along with all members of our school community, any visitors to the School must:

- wash their hands with soap and water before leaving home.
- sign in using their own pen and display their ID badge.
- scan our QRT code or you haven't got the app please leave your contact details
- once they arrive at Nunnery Wood Primary School wash their hands.
- adhere to our 1 metre plus rules and capacity signs.
- limit their movement around school to specific areas directed by a member of staff.
- No touch policy of others.
- advise us if they are contacted via Track and Trace within 14 days of visit.
- wear a face covering if possible.

For the avoidance of potential embarrassment, we would also like to advise you that the School is currently operating a 'no handshake' policy for all members of its community.

We apologise for not being able to give you our usual warm welcome, but we must take the current situation very seriously and look after the welfare of our pupils and staff.
