<p><b>Maths</b></p> <p><b>Place Value</b> - Children will be reading, writing and ordering numbers up to 1 million. They will be rounding numbers to the nearest million. <b>Formal Written methods</b> - Children will be revisiting column addition and subtraction and learning written methods for multiplication and division <b>Statistics</b>- Interpreting line graphs and timetables <b>Measurement</b> – Children will learn about perimeter and area.</p>	<p><b>Design and Technology</b></p> <p>Children will be learning how to sew using a variety of stitches. They will be developing their cooking skills whilst cooking cheese straws.</p>	<p><b>PSHEC</b></p> <p>Children will be exploring the theme of 'Being me and my world'</p>
<p><b>Science</b></p> <p>Children will be learning how to sort materials, identify the properties of materials and how that relates to their use. They will learn about reversible and irreversible changes. They will also be learning about the forces of gravity, air resistance, water resistance, up thrust and friction. Children will also be designing and carrying out their own investigation.</p>	<p><b>History/Geography Local History Study</b> - children will learn about key events of The English Civil War with a focus on The Battle of Worcester and the importance of democracy. <b>The Victorians</b> – children will be learning about the treatment of children during the Victorian period. <b>Rivers</b> - children will be learning about a river's journey and key features. They will be focusing on completing a field study activity at Duck Brook.</p>	<p><b>French</b></p> <p>Children will be working on the topic 'Healthy Eating', where they will learn how to discuss school lunches and read menus. Also, 'The Music Man' where they will learn the words for instruments and describe their musical tastes..</p>
	<p><b>PE</b></p> <p>Children will be learning how to play cricket and hockey. They will also learn to complete gymnastics sequences.</p>	<p><b>Music</b></p> <p>Children will be working on the unit 'Living on a Prayer', where they will learn to sing, play, improvise and compose. Children will be working on the unit 'Classroom Jazz' where they will learn about 3 note bossa and 5 note swing.</p>
