Working under the supervision of a class teacher and our SENCO, you will support children across the school, deliver structured interventions and group activities, and provide one-to-one support for children with Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCPs).

The role will include:

- Working one-to-one with vulnerable learners or children with Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCPs).
- Leading group work under the direction of a class teacher.
- Supporting class teachers with teaching, learning and daily classroom tasks.
- Providing lunchtime support where required (30 minutes).

The successful candidate will have:

- A high level of literacy and numeracy, including GCSE English and Mathematics.
- Relevant Teaching Assistant qualifications.
- Strong organisational skills.
- Initiative and enthusiasm.
- The ability to establish positive working relationships with children, colleagues and other professionals.
- The ability to motivate children to achieve their best and develop positive relationships with their peers.
- A willingness to receive training and advice from other professionals, such as our Educational Psychologist.
