Literacy – Reading & Writing:

Acting out and retelling a story.

Helping Mr Wolf to write a list of ingredients for pancakes.

Some of us will also be writing simple instructions/recipes for how to make pancakes.

Writing messages to explain to Mr Wolf’s neighbours how to be a good friend.

Understanding the World:

Making pancakes – noticing how the ingredients change as they are mixed and cooked.

Learning about why Shrove Tuesday is an important Christian celebration and why pancakes are made on Shrove Tuesday.

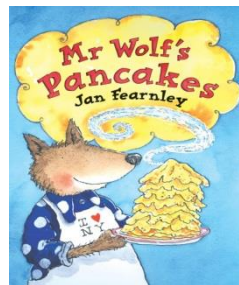
Physical Development :

Moving safely and confidently, avoiding obstacles and other children, in pancake races.

Using pens, pencils, scissors, other tools and materials safely and accurately when drawing, writing, cutting, cooking and making things.

Dressing and undressing independently for P.E. and woodland work.

Communication and Language:

Understanding and following instructions to make pancakes.

Using story language when retelling the story.

Learning and using new words linked to Pancake Day.

Maths:

Weighing and counting ingredients when making pancakes.

Helping Mr Wolf to count his pennies accurately to match prices of pancake ingredients.

Adding two prices / amounts and finding the total.

Finding out who has finished 1st, 2nd, 3rd etc in pancake races.

Expressive Arts & Design:

Designing our own pancakes with toppings – drawing, colouring, painting.

Acting out the story of Mr Wolf’s Pancakes.

Choosing and using different resources and materials to make a basket to help Mr Wolf carry his shopping.
