Is Your Child Missing Out?



Do you receive any of the following benefits?

- Income Support
- Income- based Job seekers allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit; provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less
- Universal credit- these benefits have now been rolled into a single benefit, called Universal Credit

Children in Reception, Y1 and Y2 will still have free school meals until they start Year 3.

Yes

Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) funding is given to the school and it is then used to boost learning and improve achievement.

- Children in Years Rec, 1 & 2 - you should still claim pupil premium even though your child has a universal free school meal. The school receives the money and then it is used to improve learning and achievement.
- Children in Years 3, 4, 5 & 6 - you can claim for free school meals for your child/children.
- You may be entitled to financial help with trips and visits.
- You may be entitled to help with the cost of uniform.
