
Reading Books in the EYFS and KS1 at Nunnery Wood Primary School

We use several different reading schemes to support your child in learning to read:














Oxford Reading Tree is a popular scheme which helps children develop many important reading skills including using their phonics, sight words and picture cues through simple, fun stories about Biff, Chip, Kipper, Floppy the dog and their friends and family.












<u>Floppy's Phonics</u> is linked to the Oxford Reading Tree scheme and includes fiction (story) and non-fiction (information) books. These books are all phonic based and give children lots of opportunities to use and develop their phonic skills in reading.







Phonics Bug (published by Pearson)











We choose these reading books for your child to link to the 'phonic phase' of Letters and Sounds that they are working in. Sometimes we will choose books with new phonic sounds in and at other times we

will choose books that allow them to practise and secure phonic skills they have already been learning.

We also try to choose books to match children's interests and give them opportunities to read stories and information books.

Star Books:

We ask all children to choose a story book (or star book) two or three times each week to share and enjoy with you at home.





These books are just as important as our reading scheme books! Read them to your child, get them to join in with you if it is a story you know and as their reading skills develop your child will begin to be able to read parts of these books too.
